Health Camp Report











Nubri Health Camp



We are honoured and grateful to be associated with Tergar Foundation and conducted a three-day comprehensive health service in Samagaun, in Nubri Valley, the birthplace of Mingyur Rinpoche.

The Multi Speciality Team of Thirty Medical and non-medical members reached Samagaun on 29th April. Town Hall at Samagaun and campsite used to set up the camp.

Tent were used to set up for each department, where as main hall was used for Pharmacy, Lab and Skin.

Patients came walking 2-3 days to reach the camp site. We examined total of 998 patients who hailed from neighbouring village like - Bihi, Phok, Lho, Dharapani, Thoche, Nache et. al.







Dept: Ophthalmology

Seven screening clinics to detect cataracts among patients were held over five days in adjoining villages before the scheduled health service in Samagaon. Those detected were invited to attend the cataract surgical clinic in Samagaon.














552 patients underwent eye examination at Samagaon, of which **18 patients** underwent successful cataract surgery. Reading glasses and medicine were distributed when necessary.



Dept: Dermatology

Total 196 Patients were examined and given medicine.



Key takeaways:

Dermal health is neglected, living under the harsher sun of the highaltitude regions requires substantial protection against the sun to avoid skin damage.

Dept: General Medicines

Total 549 Patients were examined



Key takeaways: General Medicines, Hepatology & Pulmonology.

There is a general lack of health and hygiene maintenance amongst the residents of Samagaon partly due to the lack of health education and awareness, and partly due to the scarcity of medication and resources needed to practice good general health and hygiene.

Unlike other high-altitude settlements, Samagaon residents generally have high blood pressure. This could be due to unchecked consumption of alcohol and tobacco, especially during the winter when it gets extremely cold.

Liver disease is also significantly prevalent, alongside a general deficiency of Vitamin D.

The region has a high prevalence of bronchial asthma.







Women are particularly at high risk of infection and disease during menstruation due to the lack of sanitary pads and other menstrual resources.


