Bajura Health Initiative Inaugural Surgical Camp of Ek Ek Paila's 5-Year Project

From May 23 to May 25, 2024, **Ek Ek Paila** organised its 31st Paila program at Kolti, Bajura, in collaboration with the Geta Eye Hospital and Budhinanda Municipality. This three-day camp, set up at Kolti Primary Health Centre, successfully served the local community by providing essential ENT, ophthalmology, and dental services. A total of 1,711 individuals benefited from the medical attention and care offered by the Ek Ek Paila, marking a significant contribution to the health and well-being of the residents of Kolti, Bajura.

Key Takeaways:

- A total of 168 patients were operated free of cost for cataract surgery and one pterygium excision was also performed.
- Due to obstacles like the high cost of hospital care, lack of transportation, neglect of the elderly, absence of escorts, and poor community awareness, some patients have been blind for several years.
- To address preventable blindness in this province, surgical eye camps in these remote areas are essential.

Key Takeaways:

- Approximately 372 patients sought dental consultations, with 180 of them receiving free dental extractions.
- With barriers such the high cost dental as of care, transportation, neglect of dental health, absence of dental clinics, and many patients poor community awareness, have suffered from untreated dental issues for years.
- Additionally, 350 toothpaste and toothbrush kits were distributed to school-going children to promote better oral hygiene.

DEPARTMENT: ENT

Key Takeaways:

- The ENT department conducted 19 surgeries, with myringoplasty being the most frequent procedure.
- Myringoplasty emerged as the most common procedure, indicating a prevalent issue with eardrum perforations among the patients.

DEPARTMENT: LOGISTICS, IT & REGISTRATION




